A new social tenant is one who was not living in a social housing dwelling (whether owned or managed by the local authority or another social landlord) immediately prior to the letting of the dwelling owned by a local authority.

Note 1:

An existing social tenant is one which immediately before the current let had a secure, assured, flexible, fixed term, introductory, starter, demoted or family intervention tenancy (this list includes terms which are used inter-changeable for the same tenancy type).

Note 2:

Up until 2008/09, statistical source included questions asking only for lettings to existing tenants transferring within the authority's own stock. Since 2009/10, existing tenants includes all existing social tenants, e.g. from other authorities or from housing associations.
